It will be a three day national seminar on *Indian Women: Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow*.

But this feeling of importance and power remained restricted to some emancipated and elite families were women were treated as equals. In the rest of India, women were berated as inferior beings, born for the sole purpose of honouring and serving men and with no voice of their own. The women themselves over the years started believing in the myth that they were much lower creatures, whose role was confined to the home and the hearth. This continues to be the position of women in most parts of India even now.

At the same time India has changed considerably, more and more women are entering the work force and are fighting for their legitimate position in society as an equal. The feminist movement, the laws stemming from our Constitution which confer equal rights on women, the necessity felt for a dual income, higher educational levels, have all contributed to women storming the male bastion. Now it is interesting as well as imperative to re-examine what the status of women has been the in the past, what is affecting it at the present time and what can be expected in the future.
